- **Abstract** and **Keywords**. The abstract should be maximum 150 words in length and provided at the beginning of the paper (after Title and author's details) in italics.
- Footnotes and endnotes to be strictly avoided
- Bibliography: A list of the cited works to be provided at the end of the paper in MLA 8th edn. format. For titles in non-English languages, the bibliography is to be provided in English (English transliteration)
